MISSING AND KILLED PEOPLE OVER THE OCCUPATION PERIOD OF CRIMEA

After the illegal annexation of Crimea by the Russian Federation abductions and murders became widespread. Since March 7, 2014 15 persons have been missing on the territory of the temporarily occupied Crimea, including activists of the Crimean Tatar movement, the civil initiative "Ukrainian People's House", Automaidan and Euromaidan. 11 of them are Crimean Tatars. Euromaidan activists from Rovno were among first missing in Crimea. The last missing person is considered to be Ervin Ibragimov. He was abducted on May 24, 2016. Nothing is known about the fate of each missing person up to the present day.

Since March 2014 **11** people were found dead on the territory of occupied Crimea. Two of them were Ukrainian servicemen killed with Kalashnikov rifles by Russian militants. The first victim of the Russian regime in Crimea was Reshat Ametov. Since the illegal annexation of Crimea the number of such murders has increased. In October 2014 the bodies of two young Crimean Tatars were found with signs of tortures. In Summer of 2015 another three young men died from stab wounds and head injuries. In May 2016 a student Dzhokhar Melyasanov was killed under questionable circumstances. In June 2016 a 35-year-old Crimean Tatar Mumine Aliyeva was raped and killed.

The appeals to the Russian law enforcement bodies to protect human and civil rights remain without any result.
