THE MISSING

After the illegal annexation of Crimea by Russia the world has witnessed a dramatic deterioration of the human rights situation on the peninsula. In particular, the reports and statements of UN Human Rights Monitoring Mission, OSCE Human Rights Assessment Mission on Crimea, international human rights organization "Human Rights Watch" confirm that the current Russian legislation aimed at combating terrorism and extremism, is massively used to suppress opposing views. The judicial and law enforcement systems have become instruments of repressions against the opposition in Crimea.

Civil liberties have been significantly restricted, activities of a number of critical were banned, persecutions of pro-Ukrainian activists and representatives of the Crimean Tatar people are ongoing. The result of the illegal annexation of Crimea is the introduction of legal obstacles in terms of refusing Russian citizenship and forced Russian naturalization of citizens of Ukraine who were residents of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol as of March 18, 2014. People opposing these new reality are facing kidnapping, illegal imprisonment and tortures.

Since March 7, 2014 16 persons have been missing on the territory of the temporarily occupied Crimea, including activists of the Crimean Tatar movement, the civil initiative "Ukrainian People's House", Automaidan and Euromaidan.

Most cases of capturing people happen by the same scenario: persons in the uniform of law enforcement services force a victim into a car and take her or him to an unknown destination. Surveillance camera records or statements of witnesses do not affect the efficiency of searches.

The life of every missing person is highly important not just for their families, but for the whole Ukrainian society. We sincerely hope that all missing people in this booklet return back to their families safe and sound.

Families of missing persons in Crimea need international support. We urge you to demand from Russia to find and release them.



THE DIED

Illegal annexation of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the City of Sevastopol by the Russian Federation caused massive human rights violations in Crimea.

Repressions against Crimean Tatars, who did not support the Russian occupation of Crimea, took the forms of kidnappings and killings.

Since March 2014 16 people were found dead on the territory of the occupied Crimea. Two of them were Ukrainian servicemen killed with Kalashnikov rifles by Russian militants.

The first victim of the Russian regime in Crimea was Reshat Ametov. President of Ukraine Petro Poroshenko mentioned this case in his speech in the U.S. Congress on September 18, 2014.

On March 3, 2014 father of three Reshat Ametov (39) came out on a single picket to the building of the Ministers' Council in Simferopol to protest against the Russian invasion of Crimea. During this protest action several representatives of the so-called Crimean "self-defense" tied his hands, violently dragged him into a car and took him to an unknown destination.

On March 15 Ametov was found dead near the village Zemlyanychno, Bilohirsk area. The body of the man was found with numerous traces of tortures, and his hands were handcuffed. The cause of death was a stab wound to the eye area.

Despite the fact that his capturing was recorded on cameras, the investigation has not identified the perpetrators, and in 2015 the investigation was suspended.

Since the illegal annexation of Crimea the number of such murders has increased. In October 2014 the bodies of two young Crimean Tatars were found with signs of tortures. In Summer of 2015 another three young men died from stab wounds and head injuries. In May 2016 a student Dzhokhar Melyasanov was killed under questionable circumstances. In June 2016 a 35-year-old Crimean Tatar Mumine Aliyeva was raped and killed. Vedzhe Kashka, a legendary 83-year-old Crimean Tatar activist collapsed during a Russian security operation and died hours later.

The appeals to the Russian law enforcement bodies to protect human and civil rights remain without any result.

This booklet shows the victims of the Russian regime in the occupied Crimea.

Families of people killed in Crimea need international support. We urge you to demand from Russia the full investigation of these cases.

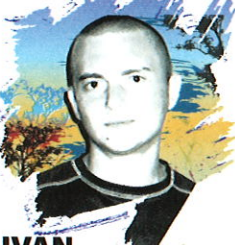
Activity: activist, member of the self-defense of Maidan;

On March 7, called his sister Svetlana and told her about the arrest at the railway station. In a conversation with his sister, Valery noted that they came to the platform with an expanded Ukrainian flag in hands. Since then there is no connection with the missing.

Information about the disappearance of Valery Vashchuk is provided on the website of the Ministry of Interior Affairs of Ukraine. The directorate of the MIA of Kherson region opened a criminal case under Article 115 of the Criminal Code "Inteded Murder". There is no information about the disappearance of Valery Vashchuk on the web sites of the Russian law enforcement agencies.

Next morning while calling his mother Lyudmila Alexandrovna he informed her that they were detained by police, but they were released later. Since then there is no connection with the missing.

The directorate of the MIA of Kherson region opened a criminal case under Article 115 of the Criminal Code "Inteded Murder". Circumstances of disappearance: on March 15, 2014 Vasily Chernysh communicated with his relatives for the last time. Since then, his family and colleagues have not received any news from him, and his whereabouts is unknown up to this day. According to one of the leaders of AutoMaidan Aleksey Gritsenko, missing Vasily Chernysh in early March along with other activists helped military units, and then suddenly disappeared. Golossevsky district police department in Kiev filled data about the disappearance of Vasily Chernysh in the Unified Register of pre-trial investigations. There is no information about the disappearance of Vasily Chernysh on the web sites of the Russian law enforcement agencies.

Information about the disappearance of Vasily Chernysh is provided on the website of the Ministry of Interior Affairs of Ukraine. The directorate of the MIA of Kherson region opened a criminal case under Article 115 of the Criminal Code "Inteded Murder". At 10:15 he called his mother, then to his father, disussed the elections and some other insignificant things and told them not to call him in the nearest future as he would be busy doing some important things. Since that time he went missing and there is no connection with him and his relatives and friends do not know anything about his where abouts. It is unknown where he disappeared and under what circumstances as there are no any witnesses.

On May 30, 2014 Seyran Zinedinov met a wife of Timur Shaimardanov and suggested that Russian paramilitaries might be somehow connected with her husband's abduction, but he never returned home after the meeting himself.

Criminal cases upon the disappearance of Timur Shaimardanov and Seyran Zinedinov were opened both in the occupied Crimea and on the mainland of Ukraine, although the investigation has not brought any results. Central Investigation Department of the Investigative Committee of the Russian Federation in the Republic of Crimea has opened a criminal case under part 1 Article 105 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation ("murder").

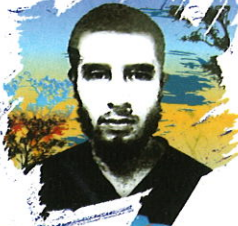

Circumstances of disappearance: on September 27, 2014 unknown persons forcibly pushed him into the car Islyam Dzhepparov and his cousin Dzhevdet Islyamov in the city of Belogorsk and then drove away in an unknown direction.

A criminal case upon the disappearance of Islyam Dzhepparov and Dzhevdet Islyamov was opened under paragraph "a, g" part 2 Article 126 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation ("abduction of a person committed by a group of persons by prior agreement in respect of two or more persons") by the Central Investigation Department of the Investigative Committee of the Russia in the Republic of Crimea, but there is no information about the missing Islyam and Dzhevdet up to this day. Prosecutor General's office of Ukraine opened a criminal case under p. 2 Article 146 of the Criminal Code of Ukraine ("illegal imprisonment or abduction, committed against two or more persons ...").

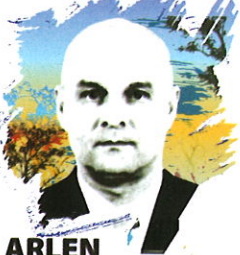

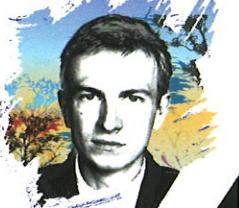

Ametov's body was found on March 15 in the field of Zemlyanichnoe village of Belogorsk district with stabs and cut wounds in the eye, with numerous signs of body tortures, the head was bound up with sticky tape and his hands were handcuffed. At the beginning of April 2014 the Investigative Committee of the Investigation Department of the Russian Federation in the Republic of Crimea opened a criminal case. In 2015, the case was suspended. The investigation has failed to identify the persons involved in the murder of Reshat Ametov.

The corpse was buried in the v. Bogdanovka near Simferopol.

Date of death: October 10, 2015;

Circumstances of death: on September 26, 2015, an ambulance station was attacked in Simferopol, as a result two more persons were killed and two others were injured. According to the occupation authorities, the main suspect was Bekir Nebiev. He was put on the wanted list. On October 10, the body of Bekir Nebiev was discovered in a forest belt in "Fontany" microdistrict. According to the so-called investigation, he committed a suicide the day the doctors were shot. However since he had heart attacks before, the version that Nebiev died of a heart attack was spread among the local residents.



ENVER ISMAILOV

Date of Birth: the deceased was around 60 years old;

Location: Krasnoflotsky village, Sovetskiy district, Crimea, Ukraine;

Activity: unknown;

Date of death: April 6, 2016;

Circumstances of death: Enver Ismailov went to the pumping station of the North-Crimean canal in the evening and did not return. Later, his charred body was found. A member of Mejlis of the Crimean Tatar people, Abmesdzhit Suleymanov, suggested that it could have been an act of self-immolation.

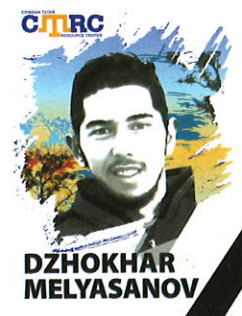

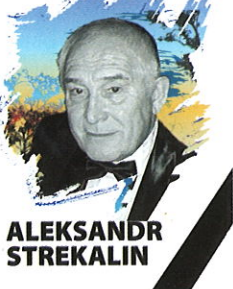

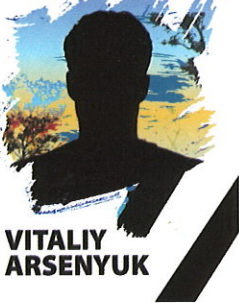

On September 2, 2016, the policemen and people wearing black masks came to dismantle the cafe without the permission of the court. In a sign of protest against the actions of the so-called local authorities, Aleksandr Strekalin took a bottle with a combustible liquid, poured himself and set on fire.

Activity: veteran of the Crimean Tatar national movement;

Date of death: November 23, 2017;

Circumstances of death: On November 23, Russian law enforcers detained a group of activists of the Crimean Tatar national movement: Bekir Dehermendzhi, Asan Chapukh, Ruslan Trubach, Kyazim Ametov and Vedzhie Kashka. The last one felt bad, she was called an ambulance. On the way to the hospital, she passed away. According to the lawyer Nikolai Polozov, all records of all the surveillance cameras, which could have shot Vedzhie Kashka, were seized the very same day on November

23, by unknown law enforcers without any documents. Also, according to his words, the death of Kashka is a result of excessive and disproportionate use of force by the law enforcers, who detained her.

The so-called Investigation Committee of the Russian Federation in the occupied Crimea refused to open a criminal case to investigate the death of Vedzhie Kashka.
